SU’s Veterans Resource Center, staffed by professionals who are certified in their fields, provides support for academic assistance, counseling, and accessibility accommodations.

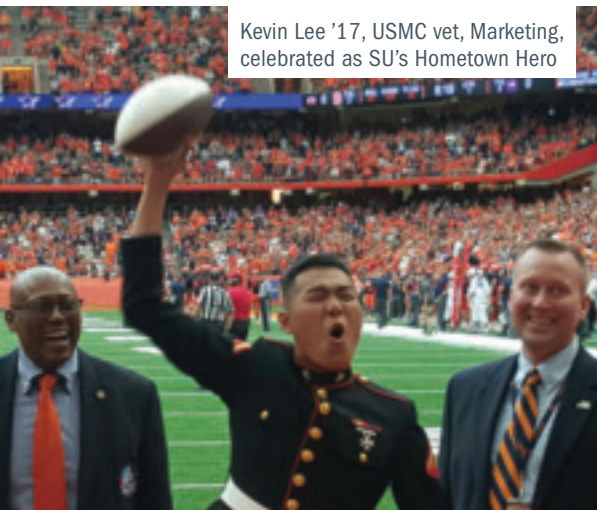

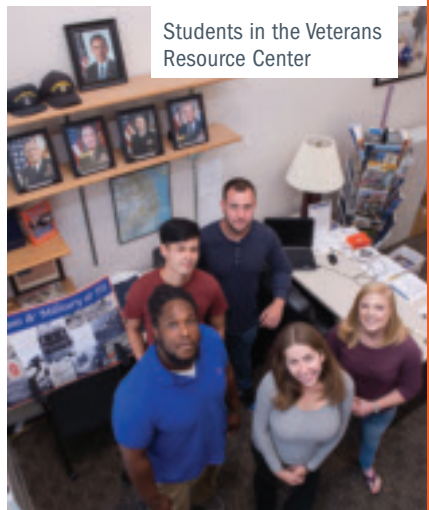

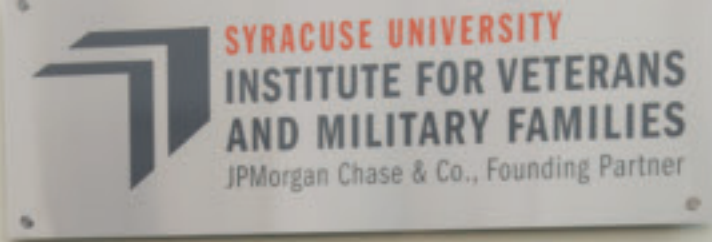

Why Choose Syracuse University?

Reputation

Syracuse is designated as a 2016 Military Friendly School and is ranked #35 in *Military Times'* Best for Vets: Colleges 2016.

Affordability

Your education benefits make a top-ranked private university affordable. Syracuse University participates in all veterans' education programs and is a Yellow Ribbon school. With Yellow Ribbon, Post 9/11 GI Bill students can receive additional funding so that 100 percent of your required tuition and fees will be covered.

Most 100% Yellow Ribbon eligible veterans are able to complete their education at SU without any out-of-pocket costs for tuition or fees. If you do not have enough remaining eligibility to complete your degree, the University has financial aid available to help you.

If you are on active duty or a member of the National Guard or Reserve, your Tuition Assistance Program will cover up to 100% of tuition for online undergraduate courses.

Note: To show our appreciation for your service, your application fee will be waived.

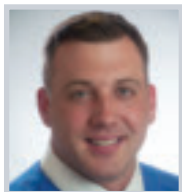

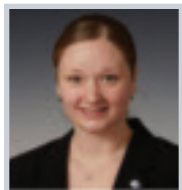
